#### **Insectivores**

Insectivores are animals that eat insects. They also eat other small animals. Insectivores are small, with long noses and sharp teeth. They lose heat easily, so they need to eat frequently. The food they eat makes the energy they need to keep them warm.

Winter is a problem for insectivores because there aren't so many insects in the winter. Different insectivores have different solutions to this problem.

*Shrews* search through dead leaves and most of them find enough food there. They also often eat animals that are bigger than themselves. One long worm can fill them up for two or three hours. *Moles* stay underground because it's warmer there. They eat more than 50 worms a day. If they catch too many worms, they store them, alive, in a sort of underground food cupboard. A few insectivores, like *hedgehogs*, spend the winter asleep.

Two other examples of insectivores are the *water shrew*, and the *streaked tenrec*. The *water shrew* is poisonous. When it bites animals, the poison in its mouth kills them. The poison can't kill humans, though. *Streaked tenrecs* grow up faster than any other mammals. They stop drinking milk and start eating worms when they are only six days old.
